Artist Reception & Printmaking Demo with Ernest Carl Fackler

Ernest Carl Fackler is a local artist, printmaker, and painter, specializing in the technique of reduction woodcuts. Fackler's vibrant artwork will be on display in the Ferndale Library's program room throughout the month of June.



Then, on Sunday, June 23, the library will host a special closing reception that will feature an exclusive demonstration, when Fackler will detail his printmaking process and his approach to making

reduction woodcuts.

"My work is concerned with our natural world," said Fackler, "and how it falls into dreams and is affected by dreamers." He added that he strives to make works that can, in effect, become "...short stories" that are "...told in a voice of spatial experiments, motifs, and natural forms—when these three are melded together in a picture, they create a wholly new depiction of spatial relation, in which decoration, space, and the figure coalesce." Christopher Jarvis is an award-winning filmmaker, photographer, and musician based in Detroit. In July, he'll have his first ever exhibition of his breathtaking photographs on display at the Ferndale Library, each

capturing dreamlike, surrealistic images of rural landscapes, desolate suburbs and cityscapes, each echoing with the hints of a human presence or the subtle beauty of everyday life. Jarvis' film work has been screened at several regional festivals as well as internationally (UK, Portugal, and Brazil). Jarvis' exhibition at the library is also part of the summer-long NOVA24 Photo+Film Festival.







Next time you visit the Ferndale Library, you could also swing by the **TRAVEL SECTION**. From *Rick Steve's* to *Fodor's, Rough Guides* and *Lonely Planet*, we circulate a wide variety of guide books to destinations all across the globe! We are adding new additions to this section each month, so you can be assured that any book you take with you on your next potential "adventure," will be filled with the most up to date information and maps! You can also use your library card to access helpful **ONLINE RESOURCES** like *A to Z Maps* and *A to Z World Travel*, providing comprehensive travel resources covering 75 topics across more than 200 world cities, including food and restaurants, culture, language, and more.

FILM: Use your library card to stream movies with KANOPY! This online video streaming service gives library cardholders access to tens of thousands of films and documentaries. Be adventurous and search its vast WORLD CINEMA collection, from classics like *The Bicycle Thieves* and *Rashomon* to newer gems like *Worst Person in the World.* **CUISINE:** You could also be adventurous by browsing our Cookbook Section--bring something new to the table, literally, by trying out dishes from all over the world, or maybe even dare to go vegan!? If nothing else, there's the ever-reliable **BEACH READ** which, even if you're not going on a trip, can provide the satisfying illusion of escapism. What qualifies as a beach read, you ask?
